

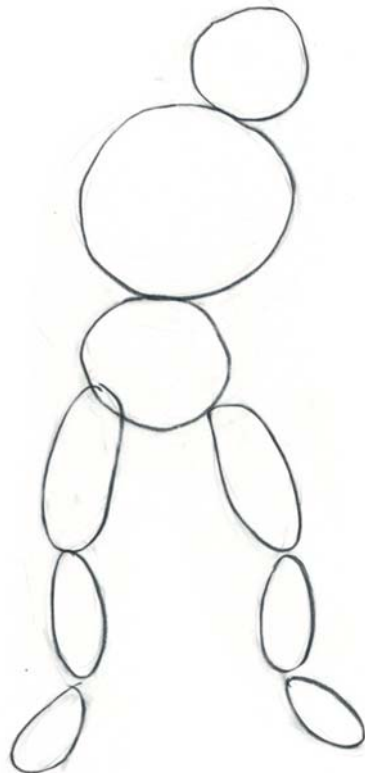
BODY Basics

When you draw a person's body, how do all the **PARTS** of their **BODY** fit together? Count down the different parts while you draw an **ASTRONAUT** who is ready to blast off into outer space!

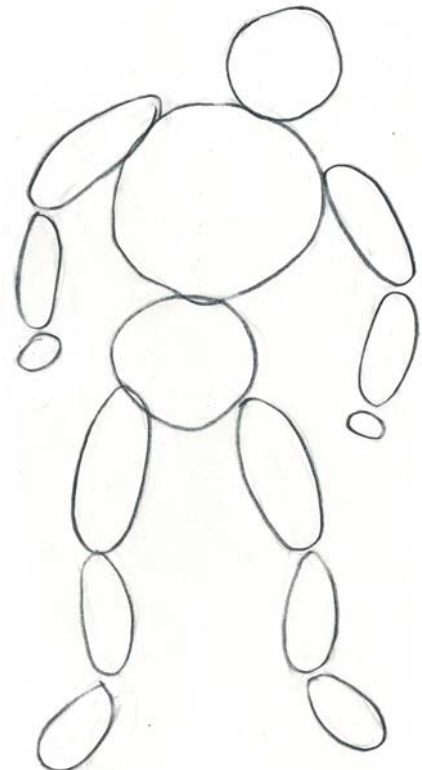
1. Use a pencil to draw three circles: one for your astronaut's waist, a larger one for the chest and a smaller one for the head.



2. Draw six ovals for your astronaut's legs: two large ovals under the waist for thighs, one smaller oval under each thigh for shins and one small oval at the bottom of each shin for feet.



3. Draw six more ovals for arms: two ovals on either side of the chest for upper arms, one smaller oval at the end of each upper arm for lower arms and one small oval at the bottom of each lower arm for hands.



ZOOM!

An Out-of-This-World Astronaut!

Draw a square inside your astronaut's head to finish the helmet. Add five small ovals to the end of each hand to look like the fingers of gloves. Use markers to draw yellow stars and color a purple or black sky. Now your astronaut is floating in outer space!

When you draw a picture of a whole body, it is called a **FIGURE DRAWING**.
