




A collection of books that inform children about the world and inspire them to be better global citizens



Based on actual events, an inspiring story that shows us how farms and hopes are transformed as good gardens begin to grow.








This important book teaches children all about the large, diverse country of America — past, present and future — using a simple metaphor of a village of just 100 people.

A unique and informative book that inspires kids to build their own country, complete with a constitution, borders, a national anthem and much more.




